As part of the Bournemouth University Festival of Learning, the newly created Dorset Equality Group in partnership with Bournemouth 2026 Trust will be screening the film 'The Divide'.

The Divide is a film based on the work The Spirit Level (Why Equality is Better for Everyone) which demonstrates how almost everything - from life expectancy to mental illness, violence to illiteracy – is affected not by how wealthy a society is but how equal it is. It also shows us that societies with a bigger gap between rich and poor are bad for everyone in them – including the well-off. This is a rare opportunity to see this film followed up by a discussion about how we can find positive solutions and move towards a happier, fairer future.

## Small Increase in OSH Meeting Room Hire



The Trust has reviewed hire charges for the meeting room and assembly hall for the next financial year and is making an increase to streamline and simplify charges as well as ensure costs are covered. As part of your package, members receive a 35% discount on hire charges, which means they are still great value for money, and unlimited tea and coffee is provided for a charge of just £1 per head if you would like refreshments provided for your training event or meeting.

From 1<sup>st</sup> April 2017 the following charges will apply:

	Non-member	Member proposed
Assembly Hall - Full Day	£15.00 per hour (7 hour booking = £105)	£68.25
Assembly Hall - Half Day	£15.00 per hour (4 hour booking = £60)	£39.00
Meeting Room – min 2 hour booking	£11 per hour	£7.15 per hour

Any bookings already accepted at the 2016/17 rates will be honoured at those rates, but the new rates will apply to all new bookings.
